



Big Ideas

- Equity is a practice that you work on all the time, it's *not* a checklist!
- **Equity is everywhere** from the designs of our environments to how we communicate
- Making time to stop and reflect is critical



Strategy 1: Photo Survey - Why?



- Why photos?
- Internal reflection how are we working towards equity?
- External communication help others see and understand makerspace staff's equity work

Strategy 1: Photo Survey - What We Tried

- Created list of photo survey questions
- 2. Collected photos and reflections from ideaLAB staff
- 3. CU Boulder team organized data and found themes
- 4. CU Boulder team and ideaLAB staff met for a "share back" to discuss and reflect



Strategy 1: Photo Survey - Photo Prompts

Photograph something...

- That makes your space more accessible to a specific community, group, or person
- That welcomes a specific community to your space
- That you wish you could change about your space
- In your space that's **overlooked** that you wish more people (e.g. colleagues, people who don't come in) would appreciate
- **Free choice** Photograph something special or important! Tell us more about why you picked that thing.






Strategy 2: Equity Zine- What We Tried

CU Boulder team created zine based on interviews with ideaLAB staff (and others) to help with having more concrete discussions about equity.





WHAT EQUITY MEANS TO ME Facilitator Guide

Facilitators play important roles in cultivating equitable and creative learning environments. In addition to building content knowledge and skills, facilitators also need professional development that supports them in challenging and deepening their ongoing equity-oriented work as the material, social, cultural, and political contexts of their spaces and communities change. We designed this zine to scaffold individual and collective reflection among facilitators to unpack what equity means to them and what it means for their practice and organization.

At one of our workshops, facilitators personalized their zines using colorful markers and drawn visuals



Sample Workshop Outline:


10 minutes	Introduction
	 Pg 1: As people get settled, invite them to personalize their zine Pgs 2-3: Review these pages together to understand the goals of this session and to set the tone for your conversations Pg. 4: Review the definition of equity together and invite people to share what resonates
15 minutes	What does equity mean to you?
	 Pg 5: Invite people to individually reflect Share responses in either small or large group and encourage encourage people to share the "whys" behind some of their reflections
30 minutes	Pgs 6-12: Review the questions on page 6 together before giving each individual time to reflect on the core questions in their practice Share in small groups and then engage in larger group discussion
15 minutes	Stories from educators Pg 13: Review this page together to frame the stories before inviting people to individually annotate and reflect on them Share small and large groups what resonated and what questions emerged as people read these stories
15 minutes	Engage in a large group discussion about their overall experiences with the zine, their group conversations, and thoughts for next steps.

Reminder to Remix: Remember, these are suggestions based on what we've found works for us. Experiment and tweak these elements to best fit your community of learners. What will you try? What will you change?

- Facilitation Tips -

- Encourage people to make the zines their own, and respond in a way that feels right for them. Doodling images and & writing out sentences are both fine ways to engage.
- Remind people that reflection is action and making space to reflect on and question what equity means to you and your peers is equity work.
